- Southern SARE Graduate Student Grants provide funding for graduate student research projects that address issues of sustainable agriculture of current and potential importance to the Southern region and are **available to any graduate student enrolled full time.**
- Proposals are for a one-time project maximum of \$16,500.
- Projects may last up to three years.
- **Proposals are due May 4, 2018 by 5:00 PM EST**
